

# **Political Spectrum Placement of Organizations**

The following table categorizes various organizations across the political spectrum from far left to far right, based on their stated missions, activities, media coverage, and public perceptions. This analysis is derived from available research on media bias ratings, organizational activities, and political positioning.

# **Classification Methodology**

Organizations were placed on this spectrum based on several factors:

#### Far Left

Organizations advocating for significant progressive structural changes to society, economic systems, and government.

## Left

Organizations that consistently advocate for progressive policies, environmental regulation, social justice initiatives, and expanded government programs. World Scientists' Warning to Humanity promotes environmental policies often associated with left-leaning positions [1] [2], while the National Environmental Scorecard from the League of Conservation Voters tends to favor progressive environmental positions [10] [11].

## Center-Left

Organizations that generally support liberal or progressive positions but with more moderate approaches. The Washington Post is rated as "Leans Liberal" in media bias analyses  $^{[12]}$ , while Google News has been shown to aggregate more left-leaning sources (63% from left-leaning outlets)  $^{[15]}$ .

#### Center

Organizations that maintain neutrality, present multiple viewpoints, or have missions focused on non-partisan information sharing. The Vermont Ethics Network focuses on healthcare ethics without a distinct political leaning  $^{[5]}$   $^{[6]}$ .

# **Center-Right**

Organizations that generally support conservative positions but with more moderate approaches, often focusing on business interests, limited government, or traditional values within mainstream frameworks.

## Right

Organizations that consistently advocate for conservative policies, reduced government regulation, and traditional values. RealClearPolitics is rated as "Strong Right" by Ad Fontes Media with a bias score of 14.45 [13], while the Heritage Foundation created Project 2025 [8].

## **Far Right**

Organizations advocating for significantly conservative or nationalist restructuring of government and society. Project 2025 is described as a political initiative to reshape federal government and consolidate executive power in favor of right-wing interests [8] [9], with plans to "infuse every aspect of federal government with Christian nationalism."

## **Notes on Placement**

- 1. Some organizations may shift positions depending on specific issues or over time.
- 2. "Hands Off" could not be accurately classified due to insufficient information.
- 3. Placement reflects general positioning and may not represent the full complexity of each organization's positions on all issues.

This analysis provides a general framework for understanding these organizations' political leanings but should be considered alongside more detailed examination of their specific policy positions and activities.
