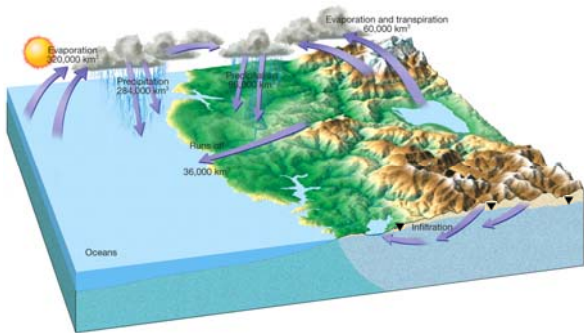
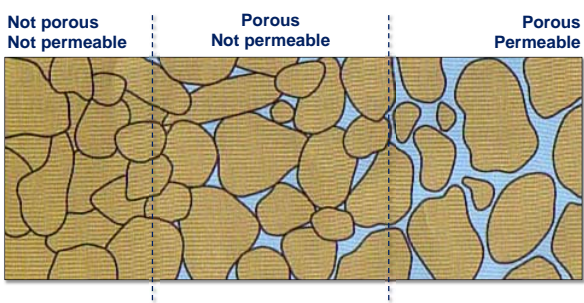


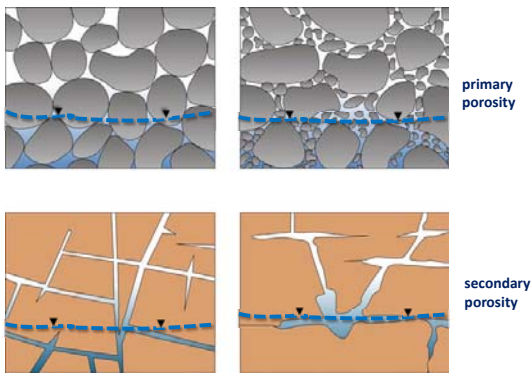
The hydrologic cycle describes the movement of water between the atmosphere and lithosphere.



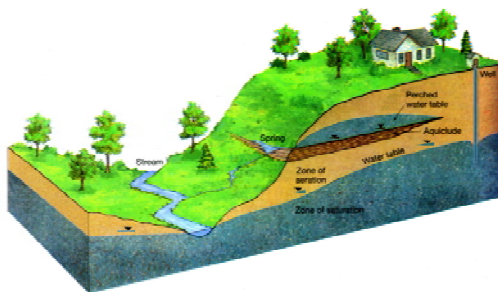
Interconnected pores result in permeability.



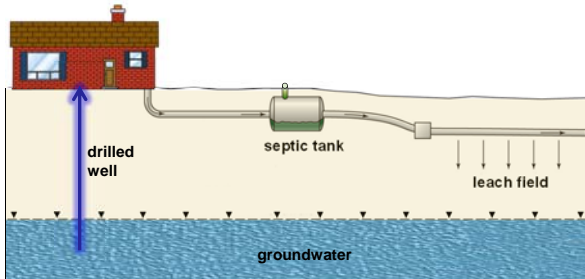
The water table separates the unsaturated zone from the saturated zone in the aquifer.
